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Introduction

The **ProQual Level 3 Award in the Inspection and Testing of Fire Resisting Door Installations** provides a nationally recognised industry specific qualification which demonstrates competence in inspecting and testing of fire resisting door installations to ensure that they meet current Fire Regulations for fire doors.

The awarding body for this qualification is ProQual Awarding Body (<u>www.proqualab.com</u>) and the regulatory body is the Office of Qualifications and Examinations Regulation (Ofqual).

The qualification has been accredited onto the Regulated Qualifications Framework (RQF) and is published on Ofqual's Register of Qualifications.

Entry Requirements

Candidates who are employed as <u>fire door installers</u> should hold the ProQual Level 2 Diploma in Installing Fire Resisting Timber Doorsets.

Candidates who are employed in a <u>responsible or supervisory role</u> should be able to demonstrate a health and safety background and relevant health and safety competence through the achievement of relevant certifications, e.g. NEBOSH, SMSTS, SSSTS

Centres should carry out an **initial assessment** of candidate skills and knowledge to identify any gaps and help plan the assessment.

Staff

Staff delivering this qualification must be appropriately qualified and/or occupationally competent.

Assessors/Internal Quality Assurance

Assessors must have verifiable, current industry experience and a sufficient depth of relevant occupational expertise and knowledge, and must use a combination of assessment methods.

Assessors and internal quality assurance verifiers for competence-based units or qualifications will normally need to hold appropriate assessor or internal quality assurance qualifications.

Assessment
