Level 3 Award in Eyebrow Treatments – Brow Broidery Microblading

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Introduction

The qualification is aimed at individuals who have an interest in Brow Broidery (Microblading), or who work within the beauty industry and want to expand their talents within their business. Candidates learn about the perfect designs for the eyebrow, colour understanding and techniques for Brow Broidery.

The awarding organisation for this qualification is ProQual Awarding Body and the regulatory body is the Office of Qualifications and Examinations Regulation (Ofqual). The specification for these qualifications has been approved by the Welsh Government for use by centres in Wales.

Entry Requirements

There are no formal entry requirements for this qualification.

Centres should carry out an **initial assessment** of candidate skills and knowledge to identify any gaps and help plan the assessment.

Assessment

Each candidate is required to produce evidence which demonstrates their achievement of all of the learning outcomes and assessment criteria for each unit.

Evidence can include:

- worksheets
- portfolio of evidence
- record of oral and/or written questioning
- candidate test papers

Learning outcomes set out what a candidate is expected to know, understand or be able to do.

Assessment criteria specify the standard a candidate must meet to show the learning outcome has been achieved.

Internal Quality Assurance
