The Level 2 Award in Understanding Oral Health and Hygiene is appropriate for candidates who support individuals with their oral health care. Topics include identifying oral health issues, signs and symptoms of poor oral hygiene, actions when poor oral hygiene is identified and basic oral health care.

The awarding organisation for this qualification is ProQual Awarding Body and the regulatory body is the Office of Qualifications and Examinations Regulation (Ofqual).
